

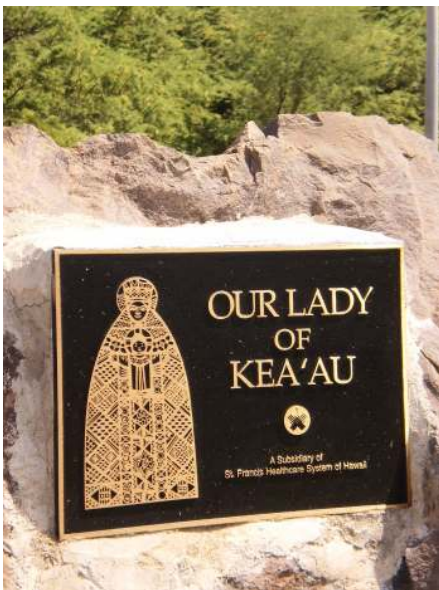
HOW TO REACH

OUR LADY OF KEA'AU

From Honolulu, travel west to Waianae. H-1 ends and becomes Farrington Highway, a 4-lane roadway. Continue on Farrington Highway through the town of Waianae, remembering that the speed limit decreases to 25 miles per hour when you pass the sewer plant on your right.

Farrington Highway continues as a 5-lane roadway west of town. The speed limit is still 25 miles per hour, and it is even occasionally enforced.

Look at your odometer at the corner of Farrington Highway and Makaha Valley Road. This is a "T" intersection and there is an electric stop light. There's a 7-11 on your right and the ocean and Mauna Lahilahi on your left. The road narrows at this point to two lanes. Interestingly, the speed limit increases here to 35 miles per hour. Continue on for 3.3 miles.



As you go, you'll pass Kea'au Beach Park and then see numerous homeless encampments on your left. At the point you've traveled the 3.3 miles, you'll see a boulder on your right with a plaque like this.

Turn right, go through the gate, and follow the road up into the valley. There is parking beyond the buildings you'll see on your right.

The service will be in the Longhouse.
